2nd Assistant Chief R. Pinnow speaking as a citizen had 4 points he would like to make as his own opinion.

1.) The meeting between Brodhead Rural and City of Brodhead Ad Hoc Committee. If the Fire District agreement is opened for revisions as part of the negotiations for the Fire District dissolution. He feels that each municipality should only have 1 vote. As Magnolia and Avon Townships are not at the table.

2.) Rumors City will not pay their portion of the full assessment of \$483,820.63 or 1/2 by January deadline. If this happens he would suspend all discussions because if the city doesn't comply with the current agreement there is no reason to believe they would comply with a new one.

3.)Firefighters are very agitated by the City of Brodhead actions regarding dissolution. Firefighters are very aware who supports the budget requests and who does not over the years. Only talked to 1 firefighter who said they would join a City of Brodhead Fire Dept just to protect his own home. Everyone else adamantly said they would not join.

City of Brodhead he feels is getting a good deal. City of Brodhead is responsible for 47.48% of the budget, has twice as many calls to the City vs Rural and 50/50 representation on the Brodhead Fire District board. City on the path to slay the goose who laid their golden egg.

4.) Consolidation has many positives-Paid Chief and Training Officer, Uniform procedures, standardized equipment, less equipment-lower cost.

What about people? Doesn't get more volunteers. Only wants the existing people to respond to other towns in addition to what they are already doing?

Don't have to buy an engine-1 year with 5 full time people to cover the consolidated area. What are you doing next year?

Green Co Chief's Meeting held in Brodhead. New radio drill for MABAS was tested for the 1st time. Host dept will be in charge of calling the drill into Green Co.

Green Co. Chiefs/MABAS will meet 3 times instead of 4 times a year

Green Co. Chiefs will be purchasing a drone. If a dept personnel would be interested in becoming certified the cost would be \$160.00 per class and \$150 to take the test.

b. 2023 Budget - Discussion/Possible Action:

2nd Asst. Chief R. Pinnow reviewed 2023 budget line items in comparison with the 2022 budget.

The line items that were over in 2022 were adjusted for the 2023 budget. Budget did not change. Following line items have been adjusted for the 2023 budget: Capital Acct. \$88,000,

EMS Supplies \$4,000, Radio Maint. \$3,500, Communications \$3,500, Office Supplies \$2,000, Insurance \$27,000.

A. Schneider made a motion to amend budget line items including capital fund for the 2023 budget.

Seconded by P. Naramore

Motion Passed

Dissolution mentions appraisal of assets. This was not a budgeted line item where would the money come from? S. Hazeltine mentioned it would have to be paid from another line item amount.

Discussion was made on the Capital Fund. T. Simpson mentioned money should be borrowed and not have a line item for the Capital Fund. S. Hazeltine mentioned rather have a consistent amount saved than borrow and waste money paying interest.

Capital fund was set up for expenses that are recurring large dollar items: Replacement of apparatus, SCBA Bottles & Harnesses, Radios & Pagers, Hose & Nozzle replacement, Turn out gear. According to NFPA Turnout gear is to be replaced every 10 years. In 2013 BFD purchased 12 sets of gear. Gear will expire in 2023.

Capital Fund is also used for grants received as we do not know if BFD will receive grants need money for the BFD portion of the grant. Unable to budget for this amount as it is unknown.

c. Municipalities Service Fee Pay to Brodhead Area EMS Discussion/Possible Action:

S. Schwartzlow-Avon Township Clerk- would like to know how to proceed, Avon Township passed to collect the assessed amount for the 2023 budget which included EMS. Now that the merger is not happening will the Fire District pay the per cap amount to EMS as the EMS bill is due in Feb. 2023 or are they to pay that bill to EMS?

A. Schneider mentioned the municipalities came up with funding for the budget. BFD should meet the original intent of the budget. Will ask legal counsel how to honor the original intent with funding of EMS. 2nd Assist. Chief R. Pinnow said it is an ethical obligation.

The Bylaw Committee met on Thursday, December 15, 2022 at 5:00 PM at the fire station. Bylaw for Position: Paid on Shift and Compensation & Benefits were discussed and passed at Bylaw level to be brought to the Fire District for final approval.
